Luke: 16:1-13
'You cannot serve God and money.'

Reflection: Where do our true priorities and interests lie? The Parable of the dishonest steward (now "manager" based on the New Translation) at first sight seems at odds with Jesus's passion for social justice. Is Jesus really condoning or indeed commending dishonesty in our dealing with others? As is often the case, the clue to a true interpretation of this weekend's Gospel story can be found in the First Reading. The Prophet Amos was a sheep farmer around 760 B.C. who lived in Tekoa, a small town some five miles from Bethlehem. Amos is called by God to the northern kingdom of Israel, a society that was sharply and cruelly divided between the rich and poor. Amos spoke out, not as a diplomat but as a straight talker, in passionate criticism of the injustices that existed between those who "had" and those who "had not." Amos denounced the hypocrisy of those who were following the "Law" and "Sacrifice" of religious life at the expense of others. Jesus, with great irony, seems to commend such practices in His own time. Jesus in fact meant the total opposite of what He said.

What was true then remains the case some 2,000 years later. None of us can play "fast and loose" in the singular pursuit of worldly wealth without this having a detrimental effect on our spiritual lives. None of us can "buy" our way into God's kingdom, no matter how hard we might try (!). When God speaks, the poor and needy are never far away. How we behave with one another, treat one another, how we regard and use our own material possessions, time and energy is of critical importance. "Blessed are the poor, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."
