Reflection: This weekend's Feast of the Baptism of our Lord ends the liturgical Christmas season. After the joys of Christmas, the coming of Jesus Christ, Our Saviour, into the world, Jesus' Baptism in the River Jordan by John is recognised as the beginning of His Public Ministry. This week, many people will have returned to Work, School, College / University or wherever else our "Normal Lives" may be leading us. For some, this may be tinged with disappointment or sadness that the "fun" and "relaxation" of the Christmas and New Year period may have brought. But as always as we begin a New Year, this also represents a new opportunity to start afresh. As we do so, we can take heart that where we may go, God will go with us also. The Church's Liturgical Season has now returned to "Ordinary Time." However, our lives need not be that "Ordinary", if we truly believe that we are Sons and Daughters of God, thanks to God's Son who began His own ministry on this very day. *"This is my beloved Son, with whom I*

am well pleased."

Over the Christmas period, we joyously celebrated the Baptism of three children into the Church, with another two to follow shortly. During 2025, we celebrated the baptism of ten others. These numbers exclude those who were received (and are planning to be received) into the Church as adults. Our combined Churches and Parish are doing well. For this we give thanks and praise to God, who through the same Spirit that came to rest on Jesus at His Baptism today, will continue to come and rest with us when we pray and act in His name.

Close of the Jubilee Year!

On the Solemnity of the Epiphany, Pope Leo presided over Holy Mass in St Peter's Basilica for some 5,800 people. At the start of the Mass, the Pope closed the Holy Door of St Peter's Basilica, a gesture which marked the end of the Jubilee Year of Hope

which his predecessor Pope Francis had opened on Christmas Eve 2024.

Jubilee years in the Catholic Church take place once every 25 years. The event drew more than 33 million pilgrims to Rome from 185 countries.

"With a grateful heart, we prepare to close this holy door, supported by a multitude of faithful, sure that the Good Shepherd always has the door of His heart open to welcome us every time we feel tired and oppressed." (Pope Leo XIV).
